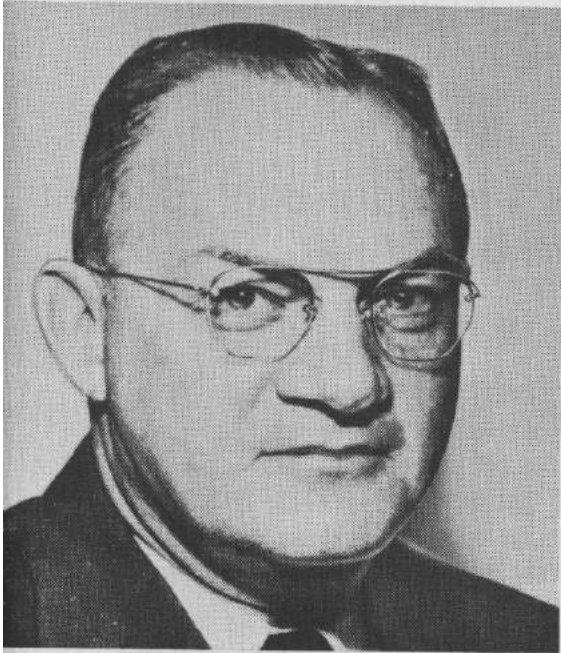

THE FIRST 50 YEARS 50 50

A Foundation for the Future

Temple Emanuel had its humble beginnings in the year 1907. Urged by their devotion to Jewish tradition a small group of men came together for the purpose of organization. They called themselves the Reform Hebrew Congregation, choosing Rabbi Mendelsohn as their spiritual leader.

Until a proper place of worship could be found, the second floor of a grocery store at 225 South Elm Street was rented. The building is now occupied by Schiffman's Jewelry store.

The six Jewish students at the State Normal and Industrial School for Girls (now Woman's College) were invited to attend the first Yom Kippur services and to be the overnight guests of Mr. and Mrs. Emanuel Sternberger. The tradition, begun then, of home hospitality for college students on Holy Days, has continued for the past fifty years.

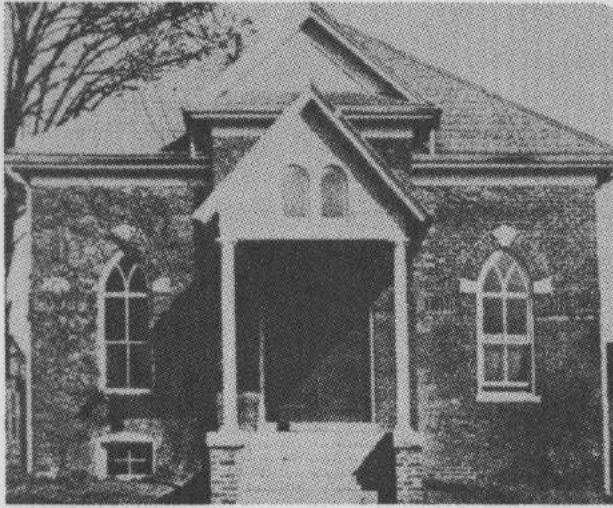

The children had already been organized for biblical instruction. A Sunday School with David Stern and Bernard Cone as teachers had been in progress for several years. Classes were held at the Ceasar Cone's. In summer when Mr. and Mrs. Cone were

away, the Simon Schiffman's or the A. Schiffman's provided the class room. Mr. Cone also conducted an adult Bible class.

The young folks who came for instruction were Fannie Susman (Mrs. J. E. Love), her brothers Mike and Herman, Etta and LeRoy Schiffman, Katie Stadiem (Mrs. Charles Pearl) and her brothers Mike and Abe. Ben and Herman Cone, Harold, Arnold and Harry Schiffman completed the roster. One parent with a strictly orthodox background had misgivings about sending his children but when the three came running into the house one Sunday morning, reciting the Sh'ma, Mr. Susman was overcome with joy, pronouncing it the happiest day of his life.

employ a Schochet as well as a Reform Rabbi, so that both traditional and liberal forms of worship could be held. All agreed and the Greensboro Hebrew Congregation, Incorporated came into being.

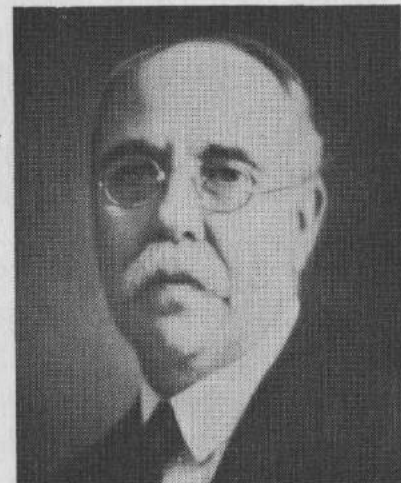

The men were proud of their achievement, boasting of being the only congregation in the country where Orthodox and Reform blended themselves into one group worshipping together harmoniously.

Almost everyone walked to services. The few Reform Jews who had carriages hitched their horses a block away so as not to offend the stricter brethren who observed the second commandment literally.

In 1910 the second big step was taken when the congregation acquired land for a burial ground. Mr. Jacob Baach was appointed Chairman of a committee to beautify it. His plans called for a hedge and other ornamental shrubs, the whole project requiring about four thousand plants. For this the board generously allotted him one hundred dollars.

On November 1st, 1908 a call went out to all the Jewish men of Greensboro to meet at the office of David Stern. Mr. Emanuel Sternberger, acting chairman, told them of a small church on East Lee Street that could be purchased for \$2,500. He expressed the hope that the two groups, Orthodox and Reform would amalgamate, buy the church and worship together as one congregation. They would

In 1911 Rabbi Louis Egelson came to fill the pulpit. Services were held on Friday evenings and Saturday mornings. The women kept the Temple clean, sweeping, dusting and even washing windows. Mrs. Sidney Stern and Mrs. Emanuel Sternberger were among the early janitresses.

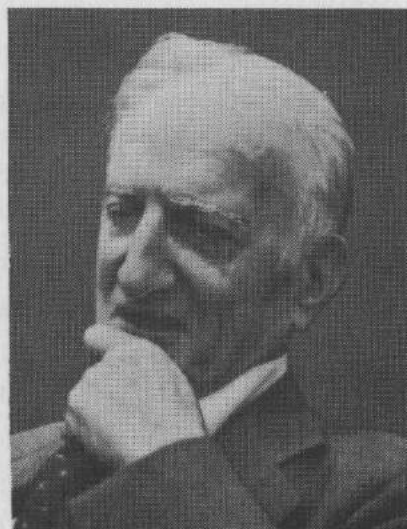
Four years later Rabbi Egelson accepted a call from a larger congregation. In rapid succession came Rabbis Friedlander, Simon Cohen, Montague Cohen and Max Kaufman.

In the interim periods the Temple was never closed. The Friday evening services were conducted by lay readers and the Sabbath School continued under the able supervision of Miss Etta Spier. Miss Spier, professor of education at Woman's College was a guiding light then and remained so throughout her entire life.

In 1919 the Congregation began to think in terms of a new house of worship. The Lee Street Temple was not only outgrown, it needed many expensive repairs. Tentative plans were made to spend \$15,000 for the new project including building and land. Then came the exciting announcement of two gifts to the building fund, one of \$25,000 from the Sternberger families and one of \$50,000 from the Cone families.

A building committee with Harold Schiffman as its chairman was appointed. Though the committee began its work immediately, the Temple was not completed until 1925. The name Emanuel was decided upon not only because of the meaning of the word "God with us", it also honored its first president Mr. Emanuel Sternberger.

In the meantime the women brought a request to the board asking equal membership with men into the congregation. A change of status so drastic required much deliberation. A year later, as no action had been taken, the women again clamored at the doors. This time they were opened wide, so wide in fact that soon afterwards, Miss Etta Spier was made a trustee.

A new leader, Rabbi Milton Ellis came in 1925. In June of that year dedicatory services of the new Temple took place. Rabbi Ellis was assisted

in the ceremonies by Rabbis Calish of Richmond, Mayerburg of Goldsboro and Marks of Atlanta, Mr. Sidney Stern, president of the Congregation, presided at the impressive ceremonies. Temple Emanuel took its place as one of Greensboro's loveliest church edifices.

Rabbi Ellis remained for five years. The congregation grew and prospered under his leadership. Then came our own Fred and Ruth Rypins. It is difficult to think of one without the other. They have each done an excellent job. Through their efforts the congregation has made great strides. Increased membership necessitated the enlargement of the assembly room and a new Sunday School wing. Devoted members helped furnish the new building in memory of loved ones. The Goldstein, Sternberger and Coltman

families each furnished a room. Another room was made into a library to accommodate the books given in memory of Molly Zauber.

The Sunday School under the Rypins' regime has grown into one of which we are all proud. The children are taught a healthy, happy appraisal of Jewish life, while Judaism is made a living reality for them.

Temple Emanuel has been helped on its way by the calibre of its presidents. The beloved Sidney Stern, Sr., occupied the

chair for 22 years. Then came Milton Zauber, Herbert Falk, George Blankstein, Sidney Stern, Jr., and the present incumbent Sidney LeBauer.

Herman Sternberger and his son Sigmund Sternberger have been our only Treasurers, the latter assuming the office upon the death of his father in 1918. Max E. Block served as secretary until his death in 1948 when he was succeeded by Walter J. Bernstein who served from 1948 until 1952. Miss Mabel Baach has been our loyal pianist and organist since 1915. Others who have helped bring Temple Emanuel to maturity were Jack Salz, educational director and Cantors Joe Portnoy and Bert Allen.

The history and progress of the Temple has been correlated with the city itself. During the war the basement was converted to a recreation center with funds largely donated by Laura W. Cone and her children Edward and Frances. This was done mainly for the soldiers and their friends who were based at Greensboro's Overseas Replacement Depot.

For a year the sanctuary was used as a Friends Meeting House. The Temple

and all its facilities were offered them when their own house of worship needed repairs.

At present the Sunday School rooms are used every day of the week except Sundays for the mentally retarded. This is a city sponsored project.

As the congregation has grown, men and women of Temple Emanuel have united themselves with many local civic organizations as well as organizations affecting world Jewry.

For fifty years they have labored well. We honor the founders and those who have followed in their footsteps. They have given us a firm foundation. May we build upon it by continuing to make this congregation an educational and religious factor in the community.
